On Thursday we ended the term with a fantastic Easter celebration. We had our Celebration Assembly in the afternoon with all our usual awards and were very proud to present this terms Hayfield Legend status to Archie and Oscar, very well deserved boys. We presented our first Spelling Bee achievement prizes, the change in curriculum has meant that children in Key Stage 1 and 2 have to know and spell a bank of words by the end of the year. This is a difficult task so we designed the Spelling Bee to encourage the children to learn these words, little and often over time. All children in Squirrel Class have improved since their baseline in January with those who made the biggest improvements being awarded prizes today. We also judged the fabulous decorated egg competition for Easter which was very difficult because the eggs were all amazing and obviously lots of time and effort had been taken by everyone. Well done to all the prize and to everyone else as they were all brilliant.

After the assembly we had an Easter egg hunt around the school. There were eggs with codes hidden all around the school which children and parents had to find before returning to the hall to break the coded Easter message. Ollie and Brianna won the prizes for first and second and every child were awarded a chocolate egg for taking part. It was a great event and a lovely way for parents and children to work together as well as explore the whole school.
