Farewell message from Mr Charteris

My Hayfield Cross journey started on the 8th December 2014 when I was appointed as the founding Headteacher of the new Kettering East CEVA Primary School (as it was then known). There was no school to visit and all I had were the plans and artist impressions of what the school would look like (from the outside). Although my official start date was the 1st April 2015 I had to start work immediately as there was so much that had to be done before then.

The first priorities were naming the school and choosing the uniform as these had to be ordered well in advance. I had chosen the name Hayfield after researching historical maps and finding Hayfield Lodge farm near us (which will be lost to the development in the future). Bishop John then suggested 'Cross' to show our Christian foundation and so around March 2015 Hayfield Cross Church of England School was officially born. I designed the logo and chose the uniform - by accident, I was actually looking for an orange PE kit but liked the colour so much and the rest is history! My first visit to the building was on December 27th 2014 when, as we weren't allowed to visit yet, I snuck in and had a look around (which the children find very funny!) From that first visit I worked out that there has not been a time of more than 12 days that I haven't been at the school so it really has been my second home for the last 8 and half years. I have loved seeing it grow, from a steel frame to seeing the building appear, opening in the September 2015 and then each year more children joining and thriving until today when we are full!

I have created two photo books that will remain with the school. The first is the history of the school being built and our first year of opening. This was also a very challenging time as NCC admissions had not put us as a Reception intake option so on allocation day in April we had no children. We opened with just 10 children and rapidly grew in numbers and reputation. We were supposed to open with 90 children with houses being built but that also didn't happen. Many of you will still remember the 5 years of 'temporary measures' where we came down a dirt track and ran off generators and gas tanks – we didn't even have a phoneline! Despite all of our early challenges I never wavered in my determination to build the best school based on amazing learning and a unique learning environment for the children. The children were at the heart of every decision we made then and remain so to this day... there's just a lot more of them!

The second photobook documents my whole time as Headteacher at Hayfield Cross, and I hope will become a tradition in the future to document the life of the school. I will also be keeping a copy of the book which I will treasure forever. It has been the most incredible journey and I feel truly blessed to have been at Hayfield Cross. The children are amazing, and I can honestly say it is the best school I have ever worked at or been in. The staff are so dedicated to the children and this shines through in all the things the children do. I would like to give a special mention to Mr Hobbs, Mrs Fraser and Miss Priestley who have been my 'work family' since before the school opened and we have weathered every storm together. Mr Hobbs of course being the genius behind making our learning environment the unique and amazing place it is. The whole staff at Hayfield Cross are very special and we are lucky to have them here as Team Orange. I would also like to thank the Governing Board who have overseen the school since the very beginning and especially Lindsey Atkins and Derek Price, our Chair of Governors who have been simply brilliant in their support, challenge and guidance.

Finally, to all of you, our Hayfield Cross Families. Being a Headteacher is a privilege, and it has been an absolute honour to serve our community and have you trust in us to give your children the very best start in their education. I have been overwhelmed with your kind messages and gifts this week and I am so thankful for the time we have shared. For me, all my memories and joy from being the first Headteacher of Hayfield Cross will always be seeing the children thriving in our school and watching them achieve and succeed. They were at the centre of all the plans I made before we opened and are still at the centre of all I do today. Thank you for trusting me as your Headteacher, I wish you all the very best for the future.
